At this time, the Mayor called on David Engel with the audit firm Fortenberry and Ballard to present the draft audit. Mr. Engel stated the audit shows the City in good standing now that all the financial numbers are in. Mr. Engel stated he is waiting on one of his partners to approve the draft and complete a couple more paperwork items before the final audit report is released.

At this time, the Mayor called on Interim Planning Director Bob Barber to present Case No. 2042SD for the final subdivision approval for Ravenwood Section G (34 Town Home Lots). Mr. Barber shared the Ravenwood PUD history again, as this Case was carried over from a previous Mayor/Board meeting. The Mayor called on Mr. Kreunen (engineer), Mr. Montesi (developer), and Mr. Bridgforth (attorney) to present any new information. Mr. Kreunen handed out an aerial map showing the drainage areas for the existing 1.8 acre retention pond and the 1.17 acre detention pond. Mr. Kreunen read a statement of what his group would fulfill after the final approval. Mr. Kreunen reported: all units are required to have minimum single car garage, minimum heated sq ft is 1,350 for each unit, the developer to financially support the HOA for a minimum of 4 years, the developer agrees to have an executed contract with a HOA management company within 4 years of recording the plat, the developer agrees to pay the City of Horn Lake \$8,500 (\$250 per lot) per the PUD requirements for city parks before the recording of the subdivision plat understanding no building permit will be issued before this payment is made, the 1.17 acre detention pond that is a part of Section G will be maintained by Section G HOA, the developer agrees to provide a wooden privacy fence along the South of the property for Section G (fence to be built at the time of construction for the home), and the developer will supply proof of HOA formation to the City before the plat is recorded. Mr. Bridgforth stated that he reviewed the PUD and spoke to Ben Smith about what was approved in 2003. Mr. Bridgforth said that nowhere in the PUD does it state the townhomes are required to maintain the detention areas. The Board had many questions about the 3.5 acre lake stated in the original PUD information and how the separate 1.8 and 1.17 retention/detention ponds came to be built, which were causing flooding issues for the current residents downstream. The City Attorney noted that the PUD text referenced 7.03 acres of common area in the townhome site (being the only common area in the entire Ravenwood PUD), and that one of the 2003 PUD amendments provides for the HOA of the town homes to be responsible for the parkland. Based upon that, the City Attorney's stated his opinion is the town homes HOA is responsible for all of the common area associated with the PUD despite the fact that the current total common area acreage does not equal 7.03 acres. Mr. Kreunen expressed his client's concern with taking over maintenance of the 1.8 acre pond that handles drainage/runoff from someone else's property. Mr. Montesi asked the Mayor and Board of Aldermen what information they need to see for this development to be approved without taking on the responsibility of the 1.8 acre pond. It was confirmed that the Interim City Planner, with the assistance of the City Attorney, if necessary, would research how the 1.17 acre pond came to

be built/approved and whether it changed the PUD. Once the research is completed, Mr. Barber will contact Mr. Montesi about placing this matter back on the Mayor/Board's agenda.
